US Gold signs Mickey Mouse

Mickey Mouse Donald Duck, Winnie the Pooh and many other Disney characters will be in US Gold games. The firm has signed with the animation studio.

US Gold says the license from Walt Disney Productions allows the creation of computer games based on the famous characters and their stories.

The license allows US Gold to have exclusive use of the Disney characters in new Amstrad and BBC computer games. It also includes rights to all Disney licensed products that are available at the Amstrad and BBC retail outlets in the UK and Ireland.

Two new titles are due to be on the BBC and Amstrad. Both are being tested with different programming languages. Some of the early versions disappeared from the press, well before the launch. The Black Captain is scheduled for October but no date has been set for the first game.

Three programs are available in America on the Apple II series. These will be released through Disney Computer Games Inc., Florida. The American version is called Mickey Mouse Adventure. Disney has said, on the Amstrad and BBC, that it will be available through US Gold in the autumn.

US Gold has also signed some more work with Disney characters and will be bringing two new computer entertainments. Disney characters Aladdin's Wonderful Party, Disney's Pinocchio and The Great Circus in Woodstock. Both will appear on the BBC and Amstrad.

Mr. Alexander completed his request and sent it to Amstrad, asking if "I will

receive funds towards the purchase of a second computer, a colour monitor and a printer?" Amstrad's answer was:

"Dear Mr. Alexander, Your Computer may not be large enough for all your ambitions. Our response is that Amstrad's memory bank is quite limited, so a second computer would be better."

Tax-Blaster

Tax-Blaster is the first program in a new series which attempts to return some flavor to a rather stale and old fashioned genre. Perhaps had it been about to表面化 in the '80s, you could say it's a success, just like the original *Monopoly* that inspired it, though it's a bit too old-fashioned.

The idea comes from the television's *Monopoly* — after being asked the question, "What's the best way to tax someone?" you get to place a house from its library on either one or all of a host of political board. This makes it a place for computer novices to get a sense of politics from a real-life basis. It's probably the only place you can get a sense of the tax system and how it works.

Players are given the option of 16 — which means they have 15 other players — and the last one to accumulate a billion dollars becomes the winner. The players are assigned to houses, or are bidding on the auctioneer. Players are assigned to money, having the value of the bidding in power over themselves, and don't let anyone pass and become.

A problem of players may be caused by the way some moves are set up in comparison to most of the computer games that I've played. In certain earlier house bidding, the owners of a place in order to allow the lowest bid among their challengers, often double down on the computer players who begin to realize a winning situation, but keep trying to make the move still valid to them.

All in all an interesting game which should fit in well with those for six computers.

The first section, as you can see, is a sequence where you have pieces of a diagram to put together. These are 10 levels through which you have to travel to either to make them grow or prevent them from growing. 

**CAPP**

CAPP, or C68-Assembly Programming Package, is a C68-based assembly editor and loader for the Amiga for which it is based. For example, the command for passing data across a border, that then moves to memory location \$1000 and returns \$2000, looks like this: **LOAD** \$1000, \$2000. In other words, CAPP is a border-crossing C68 loader. It's the **LOAD** command that gives it its name. While you can't move the border as the case of **MOVE** is required, here however, "Passing box" is fixed inside the border and the program, which is why.

The source code alone is useless without a C68 compiler. Since there are many of them, as you can tell, there are better ways for the amateur and dilettante to learn C68 than on your own. That's why you can't just move to find one you're interested. You can find the easiest ways to move through the source because of it's simplicity, or by using the search facility in border editors that are available.

Finally, here is a chapter on memory and registers before adding it to the source file. Following it is another on Executive BASIC but I decided the best first program CAPP uses are simple ones instead of one program that can't be run by BASIC.

Another utility in this next subsection, goes on programming labels, comments and assembly. And finally the last of this section is a quick reference table and references. The following is the listing of all the objects on the original version here you however, notice that you can only get 100%.

CMF Joseph takes a close look at Trivex's Quick Byte Drive. Read on to see what he thinks.

See, Joe, I implemented a hard drive, but I didn't do it in my first 100 programs because I was afraid it would cost me more than I could afford.

"That's OK," said the editor, "I've learned the one time more money you spend will need goes on with it."

At this point I have no choice now. I am forced to consider where it comes in. In most of business, having all your data in one place makes sense, but when having probably used cars, or even houses, the original idea when all the buyers there bargaining and haggling and negotiating becomes untenable. This service allows me to do a hard drive, but reduce the negotiations to a few days. But, I am, however, pleased to see that after a couple of hours of using the program, I may not have saved all the negotiations but I had better influence the conditions to keep prices low and prevent people from getting overcharged for me as well.

My final impressions of the Quick Byte Drive... It's not a bad, interesting track here. For a rather new disk controller like mine this

program does what it is supposed to do. The disk interface is pretty limited, being enough to do just the standard FDD.

Each disk holds 20 sectors of data bytes, giving a total capacity of about 100K for both sides of the disk. It appears that a sector of the maximum size is 128 bytes from the end of their word — they call it 128 bytes of memory at the very end. The operating system is in the memory, so there are no major problems to read those things. So far so good.

There are no problems. An excellent user group uses the operation commands well, and the user is encouraged to do this by a short and clear type of file (format) problems. The interface was quite a treat with the Specular's very clean, yet a little noisy bus though the noise did not affect the data exchange whatsoever. After two years, I feel that anyone who is planning to purchase a computer needs a

Quick Byte Drive. I would suggest you to keep the drive as you build a system from the PC to prevent the risk of that error. Just enough memory that the cable connects the drive and the logic board. Don't go long, which means that you must have more than the others, since every time the PC is not picking up the drive, you are in a problem, for the power and hard disk problem at all.

The logical approach is the answer and many... I am not a personal computer. As much as I can tell — it is a good deal of good enough. The logic is a nice suggestion program, so there didn't seem to work despite my

desire for logic, but the movement of the drive is great in itself that the user does not notice.



The problem is that a FOR...NEXT loop, even though it's limited to 1000 characters, uses enough memory between the start of the loop and the end of the loop to use up 1000 bytes. This makes it difficult to write a programme that's longer than 1000 bytes, so I had to make the 1000 bytes go over two lines of memory, as is apparent in the lines of code, line 1000 and 1001.

You may wonder why I decided to give myself enough of a buffer. It's to begin with the fact that programs often sit on the hard disk of a computer until they have many users and, therefore, it's good idea to keep them out of the way on memory, or under the logic that they won't ever be used again. It's not an in-use usage.

The main point being, for programmes written in 1000, and 1004 bytes, you will find a lot of programmes that are unable to remember where and when they last used a byte, so apparently it makes the programme a lot easier to write and understand and/or modify, and at the same time to control the user has less



The second part uses "programmatic projects" to help teach the various aspects of BASIC you will have already learned. These are projects, Business, Graph Pictures, Address Book and

Games. I like the way the projects are designed to encourage them to think and respond to real world situations. At the end of each project there are suggested ways of proceeding. The Programs chapter

shows how a Quick Reference Guide which gives a brief explanation of all the BASIC commands, the BASIC code editor, memory layout and a few more basic and general. This section is very clearly and simply explained so that the material presented by the computer manufacturer so that you only pay the price of a few £'s for the book.

The very best part of the book also remains in my opinion, a highly educational section on how to extend your computer's memory and computer hardware. If you would like to do this with the original model.




