

About the game

You have just woken up to find out your floppy disk is full of viruses! Unfortunately, it contains the only copy of the source code of the game you have been working on... Recover the source code before the disk is damaged beyond repair! Luckily, you have an excellent antivirus utility program, Binary Battle, at your disposal. Use it to destroy all the viruses before it is too late.

Go through the depths of five levels of your disk, kill viruses, upgrade your powers, collect coins and spend them on upgrades, find keys to the encrypted chests and find the exit to the next level.

Tips and hints

- Read the enclosed copy of the original user manual and learn about Binary Battle.
- Become a power user and master the balance of your disk health and drive heat while crawling each directory in this turn-based file system adventure.
- Squash viruses, traverse directories, decrypt files and get to the exit of each level. Your source code file awaits at the end of the fifth level.
- Every action generates disk drive heat. Once heat reaches the limit you will start losing disk health for each turn. Don't grab absolutely everything. For example, don't grab swabs if your health is full. Or coins if you are overheating.
- Don't try to kill everything. Sometimes the best strategy is to escape, especially if your health is low.
- When facing multiple enemies, check your attack value. A good strategy is to first kill the ones that you can kill with the least number of attacks. Then the ones that inflict the highest damage, or the ones with the highest chance of attack.
- There is a powerup shop at the beginning of each level. Choose your upgrades carefully and use your coins wisely!

GETTING STARTED


To start using Binary Battle, insert the Binary Battle disk in your computer's floppy drive. Type: LOAD "*", 8, 1 (Return) and then type RUN (Return). After a few moments, Binary Battle will load and run. After a brief introduction you will land on the main screen of this software.

CONTROLS

Binary Battle can be controlled with the Joystick in port 2. On Commodore 64/128 a 1351 mouse in port 1 is also supported and recommended. Press Q to switch between music and sound FX (Commodore 64/128 only).

BINARY BATTLE SCREEN

There are four panes in the Binary Battle screen. The left pane contains the enhanced tools (BUFFS), the central pane contains the file structure (LEVEL X-X), the right pane contains the status details (STATS), and the bottom pane contains the information area (INFO).



STATUS PANE


The right pane of the Binary Battle software contains the status pane. The status pane provides information about your disk and software:



The disk icon will change colour according to the level of damage

The sword icon indicates your antivirus power
The heart icon indicates your disk health
The gauge icon changes with your drive heat
The coin icon indicates how many coins you have
The key icon indicates how many decryption keys
you have available



LEVEL STRUCTURE and LEVEL OBJECTS

The centre area of the Binary Battle screen displays the structure and contents of the damaged floppy disk. You can navigate through the file structure by using the joystick or mouse. Click or Fire on an object to interact with it (or to enter it). Click or Fire on the bottom left corner of this pane to go up one level.

The file structure contains files, folders, encrypted files, and other items, such as viruses, encryption keys, and bit coins.
